STRIVE Graduates Poised to MOVE UP

STRIVE's Retention and Advancement initiative continues to make great strides in helping our graduates move along a career pathway. This October, the first cohort of our [W.K. Kellogg Foundation-funded MOVE UP program](#) completed 6-month trainings in two



different career tracks: Human Resources and Medical Billing & Coding. Ten graduates are now trained for middle-skills positions, and are undergoing interview preparation. Three additional MOVE UP cohorts are in various stages of the program.

Mount Sinai Health System has been invaluable to this program's success, supporting STRIVE's successful application to the W.K. Kellogg Foundation, and then working with STRIVE to identify pathways for our graduates to advance

their careers through training. STRIVE nominated Mount Sinai for the [Outstanding Employer Award](#) from the New York City Employment and Training Coalition, and is thrilled that Mount Sinai was chosen to receive the award on [November 16](#).

2014 STRIVE graduate Alfred Miller came from a home with a single mother and an addict father, and struggled to find guidance in his adolescent years. After he was released from



incarceration, Alfred decided that he needed to make a change and start more actively supporting his three children. A friend told him about STRIVE, and after completing the CORE program he felt more confident and prepared to both be an engaged dad and enter the workforce.

Alfred graduated in 2014, found great success in construction, and has been working for nine months at Crestwood Mech Co. He was recently promoted to the position Project Supervisor after reaching 270 days of job retention. Alfred says, "The greatest lesson STRIVE taught me was how to be heard. I know now that I bring great value to the table now that I have my certifications, and I have to put aside my youthful stubbornness, and, ultimately, listen to be heard.
